Then while still in high school, jointly formed the very popular Perfect Tyming, a bluegrass group which traveled extensively throughout the United States in the 1980's and 90's.

Steve has also appeared and performed with other bluegrass greats including Mr. Bill Monroe, Larry Sparks, John Hartford, Chubby Wise, Mac Wiseman, Carl Jackson, and other fine artists. While co-managing the band, bus, and busy tour schedule, his musical talents were sought after by some very popular artists; with inquiries from The Trio, Emmylou Harris & Nash Ramblers, The McCarters, The O'Kanes, and others.

With his solid and tasteful bass lines and strong vocals, Steve's four decades of experience provides defining elements which help create a distinctive sound for Magnolia Drive. Steve also writes and publishes many of the songs the band performs and has recorded today. Combining his knowledge in technology and music experience, he brings unique skills to the band's recordings, promotions and management.




Don Robinson Banjo/Vocals


